General description of the position:

1. To assume the position as an educator in the following subject:
 - **AFRIKAANS FIRST ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE: GET and FET Phase** (*and possibly other subjects, as determined by the needs of the school*).
2. To perform the duties of a home-class teacher, including attendance registration, reporting, and pastoral care responsibilities.
3. To participate in the school's extramural program. This includes co-ordinating and accompanying learners on subject-related excursions, assisting with other activities relating to the relevant departments, as well as being involved in sport and cultural activities.
4. To attend subject-specific workshops, training, cluster meetings and moderation sessions, and to report to members of the relevant departments.
5. To perform various school duties, including attending after-hours meetings, workshops, functions and other school-related duties.

Applicants should have the following personal attributes:

- Excellent interpersonal skills.

- A friendly, dynamic, creative and self-driven personality.
- The ability to take a leadership role and to show initiative in work-related situations, while also being able to work successfully as part of a team.
- An attitude of life-long learning with regards to teaching methodologies and the acquisition of knowledge related to the subject.

Necessary qualifications and skills include:

- A relevant Bachelor's degree and teaching qualification are the minimum requirements.
- The candidate must be qualified to teach Afrikaans First Additional Language up to Grade 12 level.
- A minimum of three years of teaching experience in Afrikaans at the Grade 12 level is an advantage.
- SACE registration and a valid police clearance are required.
- The candidate should be highly articulate, confident and competent in the delivery of subject content and the development of subject-related skills.
- Good computer skills with regards to lesson preparation, presentation and general school administration are essential. The ability to use Smartboards and other ICT technologies in teaching is an advantage.
- The candidate must display excellent classroom management skills and the ability to develop positive relationships with the learners.
